**7pm** Local Noongar youth dance group Kwongkan Middars will perform traditional Noongar dances to accompany a Welcome to Country ceremony with local elder Lester Coyne. The Albany Town Hall site has a long and eventful story to tell and in a short, sharp, humorous performance—*The True History of the Town Hall* performed by Chinjannup—a troupe of young Noongars will explore and celebrate this heritage building and its history. **[FREE\*]**
